The original section of this house, that is, the section north of the south wing, was built circa 1855 in the Greek Revival style.

[John Hertwig/Herwig](#), one of Clarkston's early settlers, owned this property in 1850 when the assessed value was high enough to suggest that there was a building of some kind on the site. The tax value quadrupled by 1855 indicating substantial improvement or expansion of any existing structure. The original one and 1/2 story Greek Revival style section of this house was probably built by 1855 for/by the owner, Elmer Bishop. The 1872 map of the Village has the footprint of the building then, owner, "Mrs. C., "Julia", Cochran. This was the home Mr. and Mrs. [John Hammond](#) beginning 1920. It remained in the Hammond family until recently. Typical of the Greek Revival style of the house is the impressive entablature with broken pediment over the one and 1/2 section of the house which faces the street. Ronk family oral history has it that Mr. John Hammond built a screened front porch for his wife, Mary, on the front of this house in the 1920s. The house remained much as it was built until the 1990s when a major renovation project included the construction of an addition to the west facade of the one and 1/2 story section, and replacement of windows, doors and the front porch. A garage was also constructed at that time.
